Special Education

The Wittenberg-Birnamwood School District's Special Education Department is dedicated to educating students with disabilities from age three through the age of 21. The District offers special education services in each building to meet the unique learning needs of children with disabilities. Programs offered include: Learning Disabilities, Emotional Disturbance, Cognitive Disabilities, Speech and Language, and Early Childhood Special Education.

Students with low incidence disabilities such as autism, traumatic brain injury, hearing or vision impairments, orthopedic impairments and other health impairments have access to special education programming which is specially designed to address their individual needs. Related services such as Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy and Adaptive Physical Education are provided to students who are in need of such specialized services to assist with their educational needs.

Pupil Services

The Wittenberg-Birnamwood School District Pupil Services Team consists of the District's School Psychologist, School Counselors and School Nurse. Our Pupil Services Team uses the Wisconsin Developmental Guidance Model to guide our programming plans, and is adapting the new Wisconsin School Counseling Model. Our goal is to develop responsible, strong, life-long learners.

Several programs are included in the Pupil Services offerings in the District. Some of these are Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse Programs, Children At-Risk, Teenage Parents, Student Assistance Programs, Student Wellness Programs, Building consultation Team Programs, Section 504 programming and an Interagency Service Program. The Pupil Services Team is also involved with developing policies and procedures related to Children At-Risk programming, Harassment, and Crisis Response Plans.
