HOW TO APPLY...

- Students apply for an ARMY ROTC Scholarship online between June 12 and January 10 of the senior year of High School at: www.goarmy.com/rotc/high-school-students/four-year-scholarship
- QUALIFICATIONS: Scholarships are competitive and not a requirement to participate in the program. In order to be eligible to apply for the Four-Year scholarship, students must meet the following minimum criteria:
 - US Citizen
 - High School GPA: 2.5 (Minimum)
 - **❖** Age 17yrs − 26yrs
 - ❖ SAT Score: 1000 (Math & Critical Thinking) **OR** ACT (19 Composite Score)
- Recipients are selected based on GPA, physical fitness and extracurricular participation.

*National Scholarship boards are conducted in: October, January & March

Students already in college should talk to the Army ROTC Enrollment Officer or Military Science department on their campus about taking the Army ROTC basic elective course and exploring scholarship incentives available.

ROTC SCHOLARSHIPS & BENEFITS:

- Tuition & Fees or Room & Board (not both by law)
- Two-, three-, and four-year scholarship options based on the time remaining to complete your degree
- ❖ A monthly stipend \$420.00 per month for the 10 months of the school year
- ❖ \$600 per semester for books & incidental expenses

WHAT IS ARMY

The Army Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC) is an educational program offered at more than 1,100 colleges and universities across the United States.

Army ROTC is a program that allows you to attend college and earn a degree while simultaneously completing requirements to commission as a Second Lieutenant in the Army. ROTC is not an alternative to getting a college degree nor is it something students do in lieu of college. It is a military education program student's take in conjunction with their college degree program. Participation in freshman and sophomore ROTC classes is possible without any commitment to the Army. You will only incur a military obligation if you accept a scholarship and if you sign a contract with us.

Officers commissioned through ROTC can serve in the Reserves, National Guard or Active Duty.

ROTC is not an extension of JROTC from High School. Students do not need to have been in JROTC to be in Senior ROTC in college.
