The scholarship application is open to any current High School Senior continuing their education/training at an accredited university, college, technical college or an apprenticeship training program who intends to pursue a career in the Construction Trades or similar industry.

Recipients will receive their scholarship funds after one of the following criteria have been met:

*Successfully completing a semester at a university, college or technical college.

A copy of a transcript from the institution must be submitted showing full-time enrollment with a minimum 2.0 GPA.

*Successfully completing the first 6 months of a journeyman apprenticeship program.

Employment & satisfactory progress must be confirmed by the local apprenticeship organization (ex. a letter verifying your good standing from the organization)

Funds may be used for:

- Tuition & Fees
- Tools, Boots or other required work attire (Receipts will be required)
