## ~College Applications~ Summer - November

- First and foremost, get your applications in!
- Then, through Xello, request to send your transcripts and ACT scores (ACT scores are automatically on transcripts)
- 3. Wait to hear back from colleges...each college takes its own time...

- Be in communication with the schools you've applied to
  - Sometimes they miss information needed to decide on your acceptance (i.e. transcripts get misplaced, they don't already have your ACT score even if you listed them on your test, etc.)
- Application questions let Mrs. Gruber know

## ~College Application Fees~

- Application fee waivers are available!
- Some colleges do not have fees or reduced fees due to the pandemic, pay attention to this.

- Free applications to some schools!
- UW System
  - UW-Green Bay: until October 31
  - UW-Milwaukee: until October 31
  - UW-Oshkosh: until October 31
  - UW-Parkside: last two weeks of October
  - UW-Platteville: until October 31
  - UW-River Falls: during September
  - UW-Stevens Point: possibly
     October (more info to come)
  - UW-Stout: October 1-12
  - UW-Whitewater: until October 31

## Xello Transcript Requests (The old Career Cruising)

#### **Benefits:**

- Electronic instead of postal mail = MUCH FASTER
- Trackable progress
- Log into your account to see if your transcript has been received

Request your transcripts through your Xello accounts - <u>Directions here!</u>

Mrs. Gruber can only send your transcripts through here if you "save" a school. Do this so you can login and keep track!

#### <u>FAFSA</u>

- October 1st
- After your application is done, complete your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- Even if you are not planning on taking federal aid (loans), fill it out. It has some of the lowest interest rates you will find and it's free!
- Some scholarships also require it!
- You don't have to be accepted yet - you can put down up to 10 schools on your FAFSA
- The FAFSA needs to be filed every year.

## For those of you attending NTC!

- Go here →

   ply)
- Open until February 1st
- Very fast online application \*Apply, even if you don't think you meet the requirements!\*

- Cost of tuition/fees are covered after federal and state aid and scholarships have been applied - 4 consecutive semesters (two years, 15 credits a semester) of free tuition for students who meet requirements
- To apply, must meet GPA, attendance, ACT, FAFSA requirements
  - All good things to pay attention to your last year!

**AKA Free Money!** 

- Throughout the Year heavy in the spring (March-May)
- School Website
- Local, national
- Check your college (once accepted)!
  - Each college has deadlines!

If you haven't already...

Start collecting your letters of recommendation/writing essays now! Then you'll have them for any application you may fill out!



#### Retaking the ACT

- Determine if you need to/should retake it
  - Many colleges are not requiring it for the 2021-22 school year! CONTACT THEM!
- Creating your account
- Registering for another test through your <u>account</u>

  - Try to be done testing by this date - it takes colleges some time to get your scores!



## What Colleges' are Saying...

- We will turn down students who "slack" their senior years
  - Deny admission to students with
     32/35 on ACT because of poor
     performance senior year
  - Make sure you have Advanced Algebra!
- Take a foreign language!
  - Most require it for their graduation - Madison requires at least 2 years for entrance, really looking for 3-4 years

- Graduating early can hurt your chances of admissions in the fall
  - 7 semesters doesn't make you as competitive as another student with 8
  - Stay and take advantage of high school
  - This does not apply to you if you are going to the Tech or starting right away somewhere that you've been accepted
- Advocate for yourselves
- We all offer really good accommodations services
