

# **QUESTION 1**

Shall the Wittenberg-Birnamwood School District, Shawano and Marathon Counties, Wisconsin be authorized to issue pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$13,105,000 for the public purpose of paying the cost of a District-wide school building and improvement program consisting of: safety and security improvements, including secure entrances, upgrades to labs, technical education and other classroom areas, remodeling and building infrastructure improvements at all District facilities; construction of an agricultural and maintenance facility at the High School; construction of classroom additions at the Elementary & Middle Schools; and acquisition of furnishings, fixtures and equipment?

The Wittenberg-Birnamwood School District is asking our community two important referenda questions concerning the future of our school buildings on Tuesday, November 6th, 2018.

#### THE NEEDS ARE REAL

- The newest building in the district is the high school at nearly 50 years old
- The district has committed to an average of \$318,000 each year for the last 5 years on facility improvements and needs
- Programming and safety needs at both PK-8 schools require classroom additions and vestibule changes that cannot be met out of budget
- The high school career and technical education spaces are outdated and inefficient in meeting industry standard requirements. Current infrastructure and HVAC systems do not support adequate learning environments
- Current physical education spaces are utilized over capacity throughout the year

### WE HAVE BEEN RESPONSIBLE


- District's cash reserve has grown to 27% of our expenditures
- District no longer needs to short-term borrow resulting in interest costs savings of approximately \$100,000
- District has held the line on expenses current expenses are almost the same as ten years ago
- The district established a Fund 46 Capital Projects
   Fund which allows us to address building maintenance
   projects annually without seeking taxpayer support


#### **Birnamwood PreK-8th School**

  - Entry and office to provide secure & controlled access to the school.

- Construct New
  - Exterior ramp at the main entrance to provide accessible entry to all students and visitors.
  - Two classroom addition to provide right-sized classrooms and accommodations for kindergarten students.







- Remodel

  - Three classroom addition

- Remodel \$2,790,000
  - Entry and office to provide secure & controlled access to the school.
  - Technology education area to address modern career training, STEM education, and interdisciplinary project collaboration.
  - · Library to create collaboration spaces.
  - Repurpose existing agricultural classroom to expand technology and STEM education as well as provide space for theater storage and theater prop building.
  - Science classrooms to upgrade infrastructure and finishes.
  - Locker room showers to address function.
  - Fitness center to create separate cardio and strength training areas.
  - Infrastructure / building systems and lighting.
- Construct New \$1,290,000
  - Agricultural education building including an "animal lab", classroom, toilet rooms, storage, and a greenhouse.
  - Maintenance garage as part of agricultural education building.
- \$485,000 in Allowances Includes hazardous materials abatement, furniture, equipment, etc
- Second Question \$4,420,000
  - New 2 Station Gymnasium
