

WE'RE THE CHANGE (WTC) SCHOLARSHIP

To encourage young men and women to become involved in their community and to assist them as they pursue higher education, the WTC Committee will award two \$1500 scholarships.

Service - Major emphasis will be given to the amount of community service hours performed and how many times the President's Volunteer Service Award was received over the course of their high school years.

Grade Point Average – Emphasis will be placed on the student's cumulative grade point average and class rank with consideration for advanced courses taken.

Leadership – Consideration will be given to leadership ability in class, extra-curricular activities and community affairs.

Scholarship Guidelines

1. Application forms will be available from the Wittenberg-Biramwood guidance office.
2. Applicant must be accepted, or have acceptance pending from an institution of higher education.
3. Applicant will be required to write an essay. See application form.
4. A copy of the applicant's transcript must be attached.
5. All applications are due to the guidance office by 1:00 PM on March 31. No late applications will be accepted.
6. The WTC Scholarship will be made payable to the recipient and the attending school at the completion of the fall semester and upon submission of evidence of enrollment for the following semester. If the recipient does not follow through with plans for school or is not in good academic standing, the scholarship will not be awarded.
7. Announcement of the scholarship winners will be on Senior Award's Night.
8. Information will be reviewed by the WTC Committee and will remain confidential.
